Dear Producer,

With over 26 years of experience as a New Jersey agricultural agent, it is apparent that there is a need for a comprehensive resource that addresses current agricultural risks and the tools that can help mitigate risks. Rutgers Cooperative Research and Extension has had many experiences working with producers to help manage their risks.
