Loss Leaders

- Fall from Heights (Ladders, Trees, Boxes)
- Slip/Trip/Fall (on same level)
- Wagon Rides (or other transport)
- Animal/Insect Bites





Fall From Heights

Ladders

- Loaned, Rented, or Bring Your Own
- Ladders
 - Identified, Inspected, Documented
 - Instruction Provided
 - Users Evaluated
 - Rules Posted
 - Orchard Supervision





Fall From Heights

Ladders continued

- Ladder Alternatives
 - Fruit Pickers (Basket Type)
 - Dwarf Trees





Slip / Trip / Falls

Ground Conditions

- Orchard Inspected
- S/T/F Hazards Identified and Corrected
 - Orchards Mowed
 - Woodchuck Holes
 - Irrigation Pipes
 - Picking Areas clearly Delineated
 - Parking Areas and Access to Orchards





Agri-Tainment

Loss Leaders

- Corn Mazes
- Slip / Trip / Falls
- Animal Bites (and Struck by)
- Wagon Rides
- Damage to Vehicles
- Food-borne Illness





Corn Mazes

- Just a Corn Maze or are there tunnels and "playground" equipment (slides etc.)
- Jumping Pillows / Bounce Houses
- Condition of Equipment
- Rules Posted
- Staffing / Supervision
- Location of Corn Maze
- Perimeter Defined (Adjacent Hazards)





Slip / Trip / Falls

Condition of Premises

- Walking surfaces (Transition areas)
- Surface Condition (Sloped, wet, etc.)
- Stairs (Interior and Exterior)
- Goods Sold & Handled (Carry-out Exposures)
- Parking Areas
- Public Access vs. Private Areas

Exposure Control: Inspect, Identify, and Abate





Animal Hazards

- Know Your Animals and their Disposition
- Petting Zoo Animal vs. Viewing Only
- Animal Health, Vet Checked, State/County/ Local Requirements
- Petting Zoo/Feeding Rules Posted
- Staffing / Supervision of Petting Zoo
- Animal Enclosures and Fence Integrity/Safety
- Hand Washing Stations





Six Critical Components

- 1. Tractor
- 2. Operator
- 3. Wagon
- 4. Wagon Attendant
- 5. Hitch
- 6. Travel Route





1. Tractor

- Suitable for the task, Pulling and Braking
- Good Condition and Maintenance
- Maintenance Records

2. Operator

- Experienced
- Familiar with Tractor
- Pre-trip Inspection (Documented Daily)





3. Wagon

- Good Condition and Maintenance
- Purpose Built (Permanent Seats & Railings, Safe Access)
- Rules Posted

4. Wagon Attendant

- Attentive to passengers and Enforces Rules
- Notifies Operator as needed





5. Tractor / Wagon Hitch

- Connected to Tractor's Drawbar/Wagon Hitch
- Both in Good Condition
- Hitch Pin Secured against Displacement

6. Travel Route

- Designated Route on Solid Ground
- Avoid Uneven Terrain / Hills
- Speed Limit





Damage to Vehicles

Parking Areas

- Vehicle Access/Egress (Pedestrian Walkways)
- Parking Surface (Paved, Gravel, Hay Field)
- Impact on Local Traffic / Public Roads
- Adequate Staging Area
- Lighting
- Parking Attendant (Means of Communication)
- Safety Equipment





Food-borne Illness

Food Products Sold/Served

- Food Preparation (Sanitation, Refrigeration, Cooking Exposures)
- Employees Trained
- Health Dept. Requirements
- **Outside Caterers / Vendors**
- Certificates of Insurance
- Contract





Accident Response

- Notify Emergency / Medical Services
- Secure the Scene
 - Control the Hazard
 - Retain Potential Evidence
 - Photograph the Scene and Components
 (Not Injured Party(s), Injuries, etc.)
 - Witnesses (Names, Identification, Telephone #)
 - Statements
 - Start Documenting
